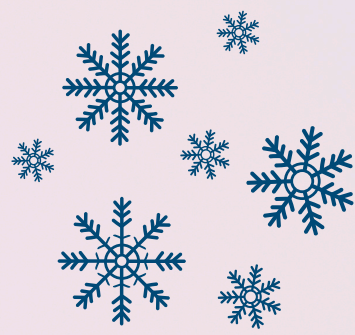

Learning Skills - these skills are directly linked to success now and in the future. You can actively work on these at home with household responsibilities, conversations and routines.

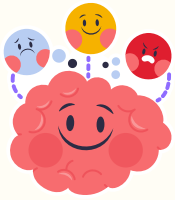

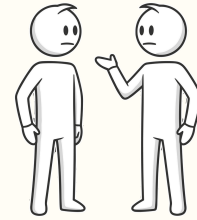
Achievement - this is a time to celebrate and reinforce areas of strength, while giving extra time and attention to areas where difficulty is evident.

Parking Lots

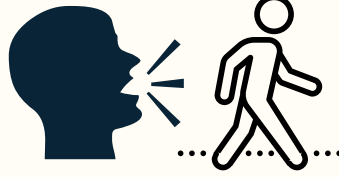

Stop - take a deep breath

Talk - use “I-messages” to express how you are feeling and what you want the other person to do / not do.

Walk - if talking does not work- walk away or walk to an adult who can help
